Aileen Sanders Ison, 57, of Wise, died Monday morning at Bristol Memorial Hospital.


She was the former manager of the Wise Inn and owner of Aileen Ison Interiors. She was a member of Wise Trinity United Methodist Church at Wise.

William Poley Ison, 64, of Pound, died Friday afternoon at Erwin Memorial Hospital in Erwin, Tenn., from injuries suffered in an automobile accident.

Ison was born June 18, 1917, at Marshall's Branch, Letcher County, Ky., the son of Edmund Munsey and Lillie Vanover Ison.
