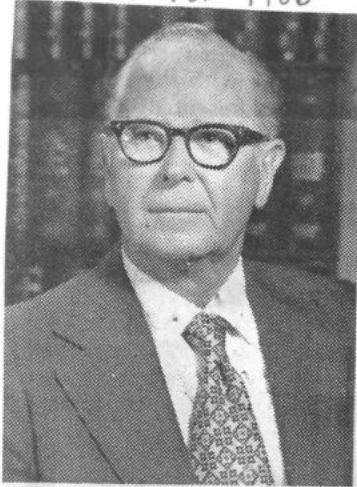

Dickenson County Sheriff's Department allege that Mullins turned the gun on himself after shooting his ex-wife, Melinda Mullins, 42, Clinchco, and John Boyd, 20, Haysi, while they were playing tennis at the McClure River Tennis Courts,

Melinda Mullins, who received one gun-shot wound to the head, and Boyd, who may have received up to four shots in the head, are now listed in poor condition at Holston Valley Hospital.

Department Investigator Richard Fleming said Monday that Mullins walked onto the court at about 2 p.m. and apparently shot the two in the head with a .25 caliber automatic pistol.

Investigator Kenneth Childress said Wednesday that Mullins' young son was with him at the scene of the shooting. After the incident, Mullins dropped his son off at his brother's house and drove nearly eight miles to the Mill Creek section of the county and shot himself, said Childress.

Fleming said the Mullins' apparently had been having domestic problems for awhile before the shooting.

Childress said Wednesday that an autopsy would be performed on Mullins' body later this week.
